He was born in Somerville on February 25, 1926, a son of the late, Hershel and Margaret (Glover) DuBois.

He was a graduate of Belmont High School. Following his graduation from high school he enlisted in the U.S. Navy and enrolled at the College of the Holy Cross in Worcester where he served in the School's R.O.T.C. Program for two years receiving an honorable discharge and graduating one year later.

He had resided in Lexington for 57 years before moving to Lunenburg and most recently Groton.

Edward worked for Raytheon Company in Bedford for 42 years and retired as a business manager in 1991.

He was a former active member of St. Brigid Church in Lexington where he volunteered as an altar server and was a member of the St. Vincent de Paul Society. He was also a former member of St. Boniface Parish in Lunenburg. In his early years he enjoyed playing volleyball, and later in life enjoyed many years of playing tennis and downhill skiing. He was also very active in the Holy Cross Alumni Association as a member of the Purple Knights and was always in attendance at reunions.

Edward treasured his vacations on Lake Winnepesaukee and reuniting with the many friends they had accumulated over the 50 years of this annual tradition.

He was a devoted husband of 66 years to Margaret J. "Josie" (Stumcke) DuBois who died in 2015. He leaves two sons, David F. DuBois and his wife, Joyce of Nashua, NH, and Richard J. DuBois and his wife, Sandy of McLean, VA; two daughters, Denise M. Weaver of Sunapee, NH, and Donna A.
