Brickley and his wife Gabby of Londonderry, NH; a daughter, Michelle M. Lewis and her husband Dan of Hyannis; six grandchildren, Kaylee Wilson, Marc Brickley, Amelia Brickley, Jaxon Clough, Rowan Brickley and Graeme Brickley; three great-grandchildren, Ryan Longfellow, Bella Hussey and Christina Gringas, nephews and nieces and cousins.
