It is with great sadness we announce the passing of John "Jack" Roddy, Jr. on February 6, 2021.

Jack was the beloved husband of Gloria (Gagnon) Roddy with whom he shared a home in Townsend for the last 50 years, and the cherished father and grandfather of their family.

Jack was born in Lowell on Veterans Day, November 11th, 1942, to Mary (Sousa) and John Roddy, Sr. He was the oldest of three children and loved sharing the stories of their fascinating childhood with his own children. Jack graduated from Lowell High School and was enrolled at Lowell Tech until he was drafted for the Vietnam War in 1964. He bravely and proudly served in the U. S. Army, 1st Infantry Division, the Big Red 1 Unit.

After returning home from Vietnam, Jack helped to found the Roddy Foundry Company with his father and brother, which later became Granite State Casting Company. As a lifelong foundryman, Jack was an experienced and knowledgeable metallurgist who enjoyed working with his hands. He spent long days working hard at the foundry honing his craft and forging a living for his family. Outside of work, Jack enjoyed figuring out how things work, spending time in his bountiful garden and making pickles, beans and breads.

Jack was a humble, gentle man who enjoyed simple pleasures - the love and company of his family especially holding and singing to his grandchildren, the refreshment of a cold beer, the entertainment in watching the Red Sox and Patriots play on his big screen TV, and the exhilaration he felt with the wind at his back in a bicycle or motorcycle ride around town. It seemed that to Jack, there was nothing finer in this world than love and freedom.

Jack is survived by his wife Gloria, with whom he celebrated their 50th Anniversary last July, his brother and best friend James Roddy of Pepperell; his sister Maureen and her husband Tom Dalton of Litchfield, NH and his four children who treasured their father: Amy Roddy of Worcester, Kathryn and her husband Francis Roussin II of West Townsend,

John III and his wife Kristine of Leominster and Rebecca and her husband Joshua Machado of Leominster. His grandchildren, whom he adored, are: Mary Roddy, Frankie, Autumn and Grace Roussin. Jack also leaves his brother-in-law Nelson Gagnon and wife Eileen of Tyngsborough, an aunt and uncles and several nieces and nephews.
