She loved her Korean Soap Operas and well into her 80's could be found mountain climbing. She never refused the chance to revive a dying plant and brought them back to life.....most of the time. She never threw a thing away, she believed that nothing should be wasted. There would be a use for everything sometime down the road. Joyce loved to travel and was blessed with many opportunities to meet up with family everywhere in Europe, Asia, and Hawaii. But most of all she loved returning to her homeland in Pusan and spending time with her sister Sunee and her family and enjoying all that was so familiar and special to her.

The story of her life and family was a life best sellers are made of, and her ability to rise above all challenges and hardships will continue to be the example she set for our family. Joyce was one of 6 children including her sister Sunee Choi who still resides in Korea,

and her brother Joem Jeon from Leominster who recently passed away.
