Peter was born on June 18, 1928, on Mission Hill in Boston. Peter grew up on a farm in Harvard and when he married, settled in Ayer and raised his family.

A proud father and Papa, he is survived by his six children – Kevin, and his wife Susan, Karen, and her husband Theodore, Thomas, and his wife Sharon, Colleen, and her husband Peter, Timothy, and his wife Cheryl, and Keith, his 12 grandchildren, and 15 great-grandchildren.

Peter was a hard working man who held many jobs. In his early years, he worked on the Griffin Family farm, at the Cream Crest dairy, at the First National Store, and delivered produce. He then went to work for the U.S. Postal Service delivering mail to the good people of Ayer and Fort Devens for over twenty-five years. Peter then embarked on a second career at the Ayer Housing Authority, from which he later retired. For forty years, he spent countless hours mowing grass and digging graves at St. Mary's Cemetery and responding to calls as a volunteer firefighter, retiring as a Deputy Chief of the Ayer Fire Department. In his spare time, he volunteered on many town boards.

Peter proudly served his country, along side his twin brother Paul, in the United States Army Transportation Corps during the Korean Conflict from 1950 to 1952, and was stationed in the Azore Islands. He was passionate about the Town of Ayer, St. Mary's Church, the Ayer Fire Department, Boy Scout Troop 3, and the Knights of Columbus.

Peter enjoyed listening to all types of music. While residing at Nashoba Park he made sure he was present for all musical activities.

We were given a gift in Peter- his smile, his wink, the smell of vanilla pipe tobacco, his joyful life. His undying legacy will be the lessons he taught us- surround yourself with family, dedicate yourself to your faith, love your country, sing an Irish jingle, play the tambourine, savor a good Manhattan, and find a good dance partner.
