LUNENBURG- Stanley D. Randall, 73, of Lunenburg, died unexpectedly on Tuesday, September 28, 2021 in his home in Lunenburg.

Stan was born on August 27, 1948 in North Adams, MA, a son of the late Thurman and Sarah (Jones) Randall.

He grew up in Adams and graduated from McCann Technical School in North Adams. He worked as a plumbers apprentice before joining the United States Army where he served as a military police officer on Ft. Devens.

Following his honorable discharge, Stan continued his education, earning his degree in criminal justice while serving as a police officer on the Ayer Police Department, where he worked until his retirement in 1985.

Stan was dedicated to public service and helping people. While on the Ayer police department he served as president of the Police Union. He also enjoyed fishing, gardening and was an animal lover.

He leaves a son, Stanley D. Martello of Pittsfield; two daughters, Lisa A. Jamros of Pittsfield and Britney C. Randall of Winchendon; his wife Robin M. (Reynolds) of Winchendon; two Brothers, Timothy "Peanut" Randall of Cheshire and Allen Randall of Florida; a sister, Susan Sobon of Adams; four grandchildren and several nieces and nephews.

In addition to his parents, he is predeceased by two brothers Thurman Randall, Jr. and Howard Randall.
