Alan H. Raymond, 78, of Fitchburg, died suddenly on Thursday, July 22, 2021 while spending time with family.

Alan was born in Fitchburg on June 30, 1943, son of the late John Edward and Loretta (Bolduc) Raymond, and was a lifelong resident of the city.

He was a 1961 graduate of Notre Dame High School and graduated second in his class from Bentley College. Alan subsequently became a CPA and pursued a long career in public accounting and corporate finance, ultimately retiring as a Chief Financial Officer.

Alan's greatest pleasure was his family. He especially loved watching his grandchildren play sports and perform on stage. Alan had a passion for gardening and shared his tomatoes with family, friends, and neighbors. He liked golf, trips to the beach, following local sports, and picking strawberries with his grandchildren.

Alan leaves Carol J. (Rheault) Raymond of Fitchburg; two sons, Scott A. Raymond and his wife Pamela of Westminster and Jeffrey A. Raymond and his wife Elizabeth of Leominster; a daughter, Susan J. Alan was predeceased by a son, Joseph Raymond, who died shortly after birth in 1965.

Birthdays would come and go, Fifty, forty, thirty, each one that passed, there would be one less candle to blow.

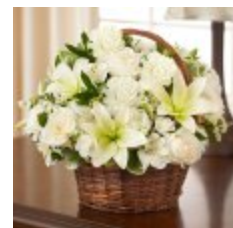
Then stop... say at twenty-five. For the rest of eternity You would be youthful and alive.
