SHIRLEY: Antonio Phillip Cosenze, 91, of Shirley, passed away Sunday, March 6, 2022 surrounded by his loving family.

Tony was born and raised in Millinocket, Maine, the son of Italian immigrants Gabriel Cosenza and Maria (Maione) Cosenza. Tony attended Stearns High School Class of 1950 where he lettered in football, basketball, wrestling and baseball. After graduation, Tony attended the University of Maine from 1951-1953.

He joined the US Army in 1954 and was assigned to the 101st Airborne Rangers and was eventually transferred to Merrill Barracks in Nurenburg, Germany where he met the love of his life, Kathe. Tony is a decorated veteran of the Vietnam War, having received many Medals including the Bronze Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, Vietnam Cross of Gallantry Medal and Vietnam Campaign Medal.

Upon retiring from the US Army in 1976, Tony and his family moved to Shirley where he was an active member in Shirley community. He was a very active member of the American Legion Post 183, where he served as Commander twice and Executive Board member for many years.

He was also an avid gardener and was somewhat famous for his tomatoes and also his ability to diagnose and fix any issues with any plant he saw. He was also an avid pistol shooter and held the title of Marksman. He was also famous for his perfect 300 scores at Wii Bowling at the Shirley Senior Center.

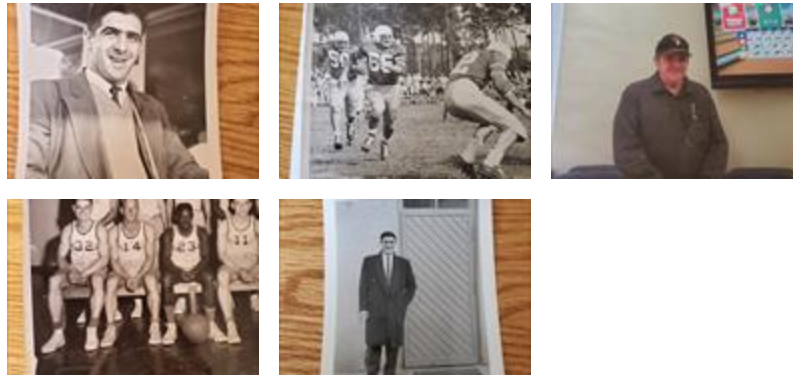
