West Townsend - Edward A. Snapp, beloved husband of Janet M. Wesson, passed away on September 19, 2024, at the age of 81, leaving behind a legacy of love and cherished memories.

Born on December 22, 1942, in Louisville, KY, he was the son of the late Martha Fuchs and Lloyd Snapp. Edward was raised with care and devotion by his stepfather, Ivan Clisby.

A proud veteran, Ed followed in Ivan's footsteps by joining the United States Navy during the Vietnam War, serving on the USS Newman K. Perry. His dedication to his country was a source of pride for him throughout his life.

In addition to his military service, Edward had a successful career, working for NEC in Boxborough and Gettens Electrical in Fitchburg. 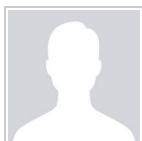

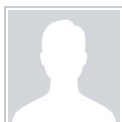
