LLUNENBURG: Helen L. (Rice) Hayes – Metcalf, 80, of Lunenburg died Friday evening, August 16, 2024 at Ayer Valley Nursing & Rehabilitation Center, Ayer, MA.

Helen was born in Fitchburg, March 30, 1944, a daughter of Hubert and Martha (Caldwell) Rice and resided most of her life in Lunenburg.

Helen was a 1962 graduate of Lunenburg High School where she was a standout basketball player. Following graduation she attended Henri's School of Hair Design in Fitchburg, MA. 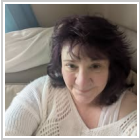
