Affectionately known as “Jackie” or “Pookie” by her family and friends, Jackie was born on February 7, 1953, in Jackson, Mississippi. She was the youngest of four children. In the early 1960s, due to her father’s military service, the family relocated from Mississippi and lived in several locations, including Japan and Germany. Once stateside, they settled in Fort Devens, Massachusetts, which became their home. Jackie received her education through the Ayer, Massachusetts Public School System.

In 1981, Jackie moved to Maryland with her oldest sister, Marva Jean, where she pursued her passion as a cosmetologist. She spent countless hours creating the latest and most fashionable hairstyles. After leaving the salons, Jackie became the manager of Sony’s Beauty Supply Store in Brooklyn Park, serving from the early 1980s until 1999.

Anyone who met Jackie quickly noticed and admired her long, beautifully polished nails. She had an undeniable love for style and was rarely seen without her stacked bracelets and signature high-heeled shoes.
