Johnnie Clark began his earthly journey on March 25, 1918 in Eutawville, SC. He was born to Harry Clark and Maggie (Little) Moten and resided in West Townsend, MA for fifty plus years.

He served twenty-eight years in the United States Army and retired in 1974 at a rank of Staff Sergeant. During WWII, he was stationed in France, Belgium, Germany, and the Philippines. He was also in the Korean War and served his country stateside during the Vietnam War.

Following his retirement from the armed services he worked fifteen years for the R. H. Rajaniemi Bus Company in Townsend. He was a member of the Townsend VFW, American Legion, AMVETS and the Townsend Rod & Gun Club. West Townsend was not just another place to live for Johnnie Clark, he captured the hearts of the residents and was affectionately known throughout the town as "JC". He was a well known member of the community and was both loved and respected.

He continued providing joy, wisdom, and mischief until the day of his passing on April 14, 2017 around 6:00 am. He will be missed by many including family, friends, nurses, and the many men and women he developed a friendship with at the Veteran's Community Center in Bedford.

He leaves behind to cherish his memories for daughters, six sons, a host of grandchildren, great grandchildren, and great great grandchildren along with nieces, nephews, and many other relatives and friends.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Rosalee and one of his sons, Tommy.
