SHIRLEY: June Philomena Lavalley - Poet / Artist, passed away peacefully at age 95.

Born in Tewksbury, MA in 1929, she spent her fondest childhood years in Maine. Graduated 1947, Bartlett High School, Webster, MA. Associate in Human Services, Mt. Wachusett Community College, 1982. B.A in English, Professional Writing, Fitchburg State University, 1986.

Married in 1948 to Lawrence N. Lavalley. Well-known local artist, with exhibits at Harvard Public Library, Fitchburg Savings, and Lawrence Academy in Groton. A poet, she had given many readings, Florence Roche School, Barnes & Noble, Trinity Chapel in Shirley, and more. She has several volumes of poetry completed, and has published *Echoes of the Muse* (1996).

She leaves children, Lise of Charlotte, NC, David of Columbia, SC and Lawrence of Port Charlotte, FL, six grandchildren, three great grandchildren, and is preceded in death by daughter, Laurie.

In addition to a lifetime of creativity, June made a lasting impact on many lives as a committed member of her spiritual community for over 44 years.
