



Lawrence J. Lincourt

December 26, 1924 - January 31, 2022

FITCHBURG – Lawrence J. Lincourt, 97, longtime resident of Fitchburg passed away on Monday, January 31, 2022 at Leominster Hospital after a brief illness.

Larry was born in Fitchburg, December 26, 1924, son of the late Eugene and Emma (Mayer) Lincourt.

In his youth, Larry lived in Canada and returned to the United States where the family resided in the Greektown section of Fitchburg.

Larry attended School Street School. He often spoke of how much he loved the people in Greektown for being so welcoming of his family into the community. At the time, Larry only spoke French and the neighbors taught him to speak the English language.

Larry enlisted in the US Navy in 1942 and proudly served his country during WWII until his honorable discharge in 1946 as a Pharmacist's Mate, Second Class from the USS Malvern and US Fleet Hospital #115. He was issued the WWII Victory Medal and Asiatic-Pacific Ribbon, American Theatre Ribbon and Good Conduct Medal.

Upon returning to Fitchburg after his military service, Larry worked for Louis

DeJonge Coating Mill, which later became Weyerhaeuser Paper Mill, and then James River Paper Company, for 40 years. He retired from working in the boiler room as an Engineer 3rd Class in 1986 when the plant closed. Due to his faithful military service, Larry never received his High School diploma, consequently, in November 1999, he was awarded his diploma at a ceremony held at Fitchburg High School.

Larry loved the outdoors. He was a hunter, fisherman, golfer, and downhill skier well into his 80's. He played hockey for the Old Timers League until his 70's. An avid sports fan, Larry also loved watching the Bruins. Larry loved to tell stories that captured everyone's attention about his outdoor adventures.

Larry was a member of St. Joseph's Parish. He enjoyed his Tuesday mornings church cleaning with the "Over the Hill Gang". He was a lifelong member of the American Legion Post #429.

Larry is survived by his seven children; Linda Teittinen and her husband Bruce of Fitchburg, Joan David of Fitchburg, Donna Hiatt and her husband Frank of Leominster, Barbara Couture and her husband Michael, Larry Lincourt, Paula Lincourt all of Fitchburg, Sandra Charpentier of Whitman, grandchildren; Jill David and her partner Eric Appleton, Kara David and her husband Dennis Comeau, Adam Hiatt, Ross Hiatt, Jessica Hiatt, Matthew Charpentier, Danielle Charpentier, great-grandchildren; Miles Appleton, Amaya LaFrance , Austin Comeau, brother-in-law Richard Chalifoux as well as nieces and nephews.

His wife of 44 years, Pauline (Chalifoux) Lincourt passed away in October 1996. He was predeceased by his brother Leo Lincourt, brother-in-law Ray "C" Chalifoux, and sister-in-law Claire McNamara.

Larry will forever be remembered as a loving son, brother, husband, father, father-in-law, grandfather, great-grandfather, brother-in-law, uncle and friend.

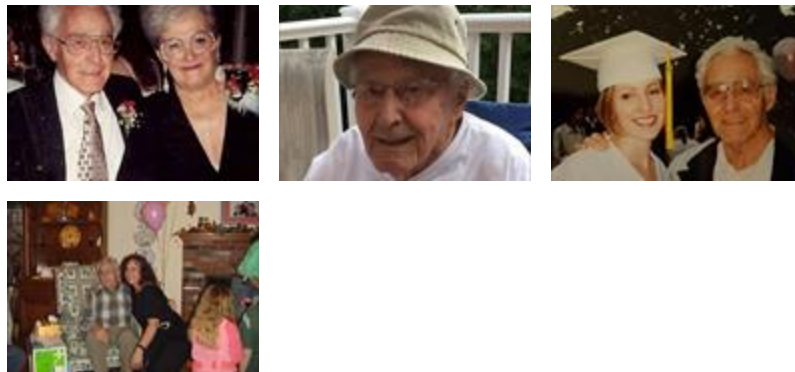

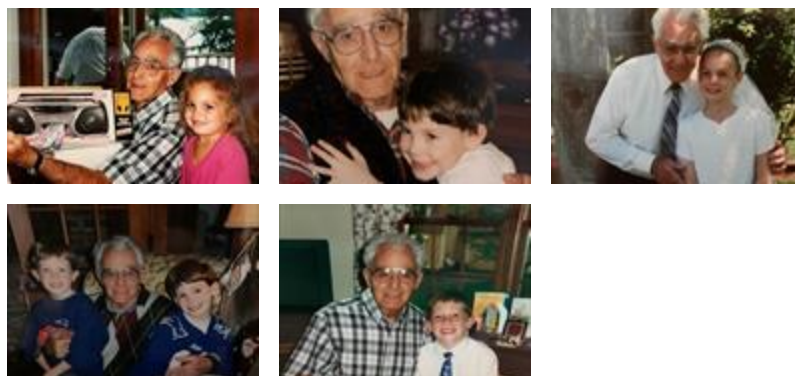
