



## Philippe G. LeBlanc

September 6, 1933 - February 6, 2025

Fitchburg – Philippe G. LeBlanc, 91, of Fitchburg, passed away peacefully on February 6, 2025 surrounded by his loving family, after a short stay at the LifeCare Center of Leominster.

Philippe was born in Barachois, New Brunswick, Canada on September 6, 1933, a son of the late George and Lucie (Leger) LeBlanc.
