LEOMINSTER: Rudolph J. "Red" Leger, 87, of Leominster, a former longtime resident of Fitchburg, died Thursday, January 23, 2020 at his home.

Mr. Leger was born in Fitchburg, February 10, 1932, a son of Adolph and Emma (Marley) Leger and resided most of his life in Fitchburg before moving to Leominster fifteen years ago.

Mr. Leger worked several years at DeJohn Paper Company in Fitchburg and later at R&R Jewelers also in Fitchburg and Millbrook Distributors in Leicester. He leaves his wife of fifteen years, Annette (Chouinard) Bergeron Leger; six sons, Steven M. Leger and his wife, Michele of Abingdon, MD, Brian D. Leger and his wife, Lisa of Hubbardston, Mark E.
