Fitchburg - Tracy Marie (Evans) Blanchard, 52, passed away on March 8, 2025, at Health Alliance Hospital in Leominster, Massachusetts.

Tracy was born on September 9, 1972, in Fitchburg, Massachusetts - where she was raised and spent the majority of her adult life. Tracy lived a life filled with love, resilience, and an unwavering faith that guided her through every challenge.

A graduate of Monty Tech, Tracy dedicated much of her career to caring for others. She worked as a Certified Nursing Assistant in both hospital and home care settings, where she not only provided physical support but also ministered to her patients spiritually. Earlier in her career, she served as a paraprofessional, finding immense joy in helping children with disabilities. However, the role she cherished most was being a stay-at-home mother while her children were young—a time she held closest to her heart.

Tracy's love for her family was boundless. She leaves behind five children: Samantha and son-in-law Shane Boucher of Sterling, Massachusetts; Dakota Miner of Westminster, Massachusetts; Jordan Blanchard, James Blanchard III, and Jacob Blanchard, all of Hubbardston, Massachusetts. She was a proud grandmother to Adrianna and Trevor Boucher. Tracy is also survived by her father Larry Evans Sr., two brothers Larry Evans Jr. and William Evans, as

well as a niece and nephews, many aunts, uncles, and cousins. She was predeceased by her beloved mother, Donna (Lancey) Evans, and both her paternal and maternal grandparents.

Tracy's presence could light up any room with her contagious laughter and warm spirit. She had an incredible ability to make others feel welcomed and often brought joy through humor—even if it meant laughing at one's clumsiness or injury. Tracy was fearless in her pursuit of happiness and never hesitated to share her deep love for Jesus with those around her.

Her journey was not without struggles; she faced battles with addiction but remained steadfast in her determination to recover. Her tenacity and strength carried her through difficult times as she fought tirelessly to return to the best version of herself. Tracy often advocated for sobriety—not just for herself but for others—hoping that her legacy would inspire those seeking recovery.

A Celebration of Life will be held on March 20, 2025, at the Knights of Columbus in Fitchburg, Massachusetts (165 Electric Ave). The gathering will take place from 4:00 PM to 8:00 PM, with a Memorial Tribute beginning at 5:30 PM.

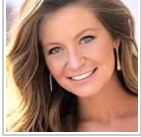
